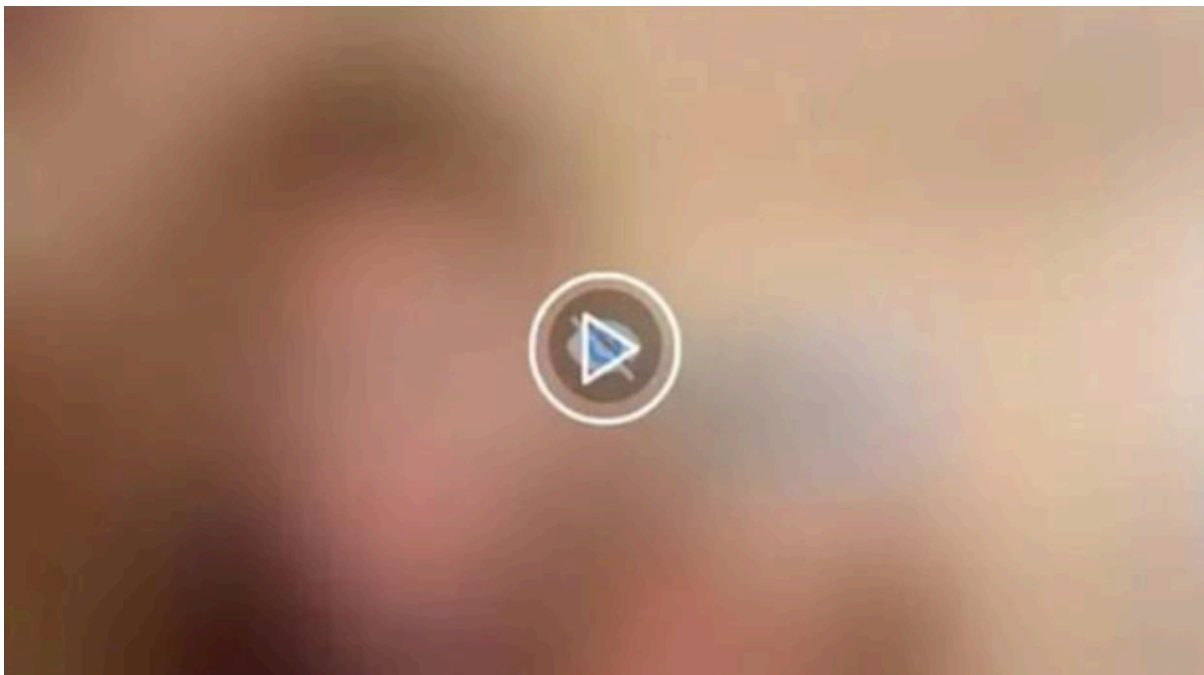


Video de La Yacuny: ¿Por qué es viral en redes sociales?

Popular caption: *“This is the truth we’re too scared to say aloud.”*

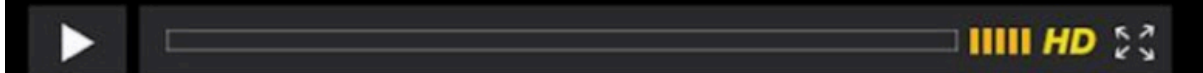
But not everyone clapped.
